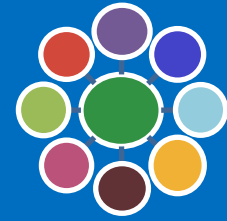


# Tri-County Opioid Safety Coalition: Clackamas, Multnomah, & Washington Counties

## Coordinating Committee June 2017 Meeting Summary



### Featured Projects

- [CODA](#) and [Central City Concern](#) described their [Wheelhouse](#) model for MAT. The project launched in March 2017 with substance use treatment providers in each of our region's counties. They cannot expand the project to other treatment providers or clinician types at this time, but keep watching. - Multnomah County's Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion ([LEAD®](#)) program was launched in February of 2017. Multnomah LEAD® is a pre-booking diversion program that allows police officers to redirect individuals engaged in low-level drug activity to services and resources specific to the individual's needs instead of jail and prosecution. 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### General Updates

- [Opioid prescribing](#) in Oregon has decreased over the last six quarters (outpatient fills).
- The [Tri-County](#) Monitoring work group is convened and will develop a monitoring proposal to be presented during the September Coordinating Committee meeting. (This effort is being coordinated with OHA monitoring activities.)
- [Chinese fentanyl](#) is the most common non-pharmaceutical source of fentanyl on our streets. Associated overdoses have been known to be difficult to overturn with the typical dosage of naloxone. There have been incidents in the US of both first responders and police dogs overdosing from exposure to granular amounts. The Centers for Disease Control has published [self protection guidelines](#) for individuals coming into contact with fentanyl and the DEA released a [fentanyl publication](#) for first responders. - The CCOs in the region are discussing the “principles of care” for substance use treatment. They are currently developing a document and intend to get feedback from clinicians and additional stakeholders by fall 2017.

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## Legislative Updates

- Oregon House Bill [2114](#): Peer Review committee for high prescribers. Governor signed.
- Oregon House Bill [3440](#): Removes special training requirement from statutes governing naloxone; prohibits exclusion from specialty courts solely because individual is on MAT; and requires a statewide, searchable inventory of MAT services. *Passed waiting for Governor’s signature.*
